Ashley Thorsen has been a Mite Technician at the Royal Alberta Museum for close to 5 years, where she predominantly works on the Alberta Biodiversity Monitoring Institute (ABMI) project. She has a degree in Conservation Biology from the University of Alberta, and a Renewable Resources diploma from NAIT. When she started in ecology, she thought she would have a career in birds or botany, but she took a detour into the world of micro-invertebrates, and has been happily spending her days at a microscope ever since. Her favourite parts of her job are: spotting the tricky little differences between species, learning more about mites and other soil invertebrates, and sharing the remarkableness of this hidden world with others.
